FAMILY GAMES

The Futures Committee resolved some months ago, that it is important to the continuing viability of the club, that we remain relevant to the community, and actively seek to expose our activities to the public. A number of initiatives are being implemented to increase our exposure and recognition.

Recently the Braemar Gallery at Springwood called for expressions of interest from artists and sculptors to suggest one or two sculptures on concrete slabs out the front of the Gallery. The club submitted a proposal for two art works to be constructed and erected for a period of three to six months. The Gallery enthusiastically accepted the proposal, and details are now in the process of being finalized. They have indicated that if they can be completed by the end of May next year, the sculptures could possibly be on display for up to six months.



The proposal is for two groupings of chess pieces, one either side of the entry path, representing conflicting views of two opposing family groups, just as chess represents a battle to the end. I presented small models

of the proposal at show and tell last month. The pieces would range in size from 1.7m high down to 0.5m, and will provide ample opportunities for members to participate in fabricating and turning activities.

I know some of you will say that this is not traditional woodturning, and I agree, but many of the objects we turn today certainly

would not have been considered traditional one or two hundred years ago. Pyrography, multi-coloured finishes, natural edges, multi or off-centered techniques, were not commonplace as they are now.

Many years ago there was a very large tree (fig I think) growing at the top of the Razorback Mountain on the Hume Highway near Picton, and was used as a symbol for a large Sydney emporium called Anthony Horden & Sons whose motto was *“While I live I grow”*. Anthony Horden has long gone as has their tree a few years later! It is perhaps a long bow to draw to suggest that if we don’t continue to adapt and explore new potentials for woodturning, the craft could also go the way of Anthony Horden. Let’s not risk it. Why don’t we adopt their motto, and continue to live and grow!

I am more than happy to discuss my concepts of what art is and how turning can, and should be a way to create art works. More importantly I am happy to explain how this project requires simple, traditional turning skills that have been used for centuries. We are not trying to revolutionize woodturning, only the things we make with it. I hope many of you will join in this new project and make it even more successful and exciting than the Armistice Memorial.
