Testing the Grey Matter, by Ernie Newman

- 1. Will all species of wood fade to just one colour if continuously exposed to rain?
- 2. Is it possible to turn spheres by hand and eye [without pivoting cutters, controlled feed or computers] which are true enough to use successfully for billiards?
- 3. An eggcup may be turned from wood held in a scroll chuck [eg a Nova chuck], a cupchuck or a screwchuck [with a single, central, projecting screw]. Which method is most likely to fail?
- 4. Who said, 'Cut wood the way it wants to be cut': Frank Pain, Joh Bjelke Peterson or Lyndon Baines Johnson?

Taking photographs is simple ... taking a well illuminated photograph can get complex. Harsh shadows, over-bright highlight, too many things in the background, the list goes on.

Traditionally in a studio I would set up a main light using a softbox light source to diffuse the light, eliminating a lot of wrinkles and crows feet in a portrait. Then I would add a fill light off the opposite side to help a bit more, generally 2-3 stops down in intensity and sometimes more depending on the subject and the effect I am looking for. Next is a hair light aimed at the back of the head to lift the subject off the background, baffles or barn doors are used to stop the hair light flaring into the cameras lens.

I don't know about you, but I don't have access to thousands of dollars of equipment, lighting, background rolls, etc, let alone a studio bigger than the building that the club meets in.

If you are photographing smaller items and want a quick easy setup then have a look at the humble light tent.



This little 26cm pouch contains a folding light tent that opens to 55cm x 55 cm x 68 cm high and came with white, black and red backgrounds, I have also add some additional background colours.



It's simple to use, just remove it from the pouch and open it up, place outside in indirect or direct sun or use lamps as a light source (make sure you select the correct light source in your camera settings). Then secure the coloured background to the velcro inside, add the front door that has a slit in it for the camera lens to poke through and take your photographs.

The idea of a light tent is to give very even lighting to a subject cutting out harsh shadows.

I purchased mine from eBay years ago.

Answers to testing the grey matter...

- According to Keith Bootle, author of <u>Wood in Australia</u>, all species of w o o d f a d e t o g r e y w h e n continuously exposed to rain.
- Billiards was played with hand turned balls for centuries. When diameters vary by no more than 0.2mm [8 thousandths of an inch] all over a sphere it will run true, at least it will on my father's home made billiard table.
- 3. An eggcup may be held very securely in a scroll chuck such as a Nova chuck or in a cupchuck. A screwchuck [with a single, central, projecting screw] would be more likely to fail because screwchucks are designed to hold sidegrain wood where the grain runs across the lathe bed. An eggcup is generally made from wood with the grain running along the lathe bed so the screw has little holding power.
- Englishman Frank Pain used the expression, 'Cut wood the way it wants to be cut', in his 1953 classic, <u>The</u> <u>Practical Woodturner</u>, a book which is packed with useful tips and droll humour.
